It is one of the working languages of the U.N.O., it is by far the more frequently used both in debate and in general conduct of UN business. By foreign language we mean a language as used by someone for communication across frontiers or with people who are not his country men. No language is more widely studied or used as a foreign language than English. Many speaking
